GIFT AID AND GIVE AS YOU EARN

If you pay tax in the UK please ensure you complete and return a gift aid form. You only need to do this once, and then we can reclaim the basic rate of tax on the gifts you give, whether you give by regular donation or one-off gifts. Then if you give £100, we get £125. If you pay tax at the higher rate then it will cost you just £75 to give the church £125 after reclaims. Some employers operate the Give As You Earn scheme where your gift comes out of your pre-tax salary. Do talk with Chris Weir at St Andrew's or in the church office to find out more about making your giving tax-efficient.

As we consider seriously the Bible's teaching regarding sacrificial giving, modelled on and motivated by Christ's sacrifice on the cross, we recognise that there is real cost to us, but also that giving motivated by grace pleases our Heavenly Father. Many Christians testify to the joy that comes from giving generously to gospel work and seeing the fruit in people's lives. A wonderful Bible passage on the grace of giving is 2 Corinthians 8 & 9 and it is worth prayerfully studying mensely grateful to God for each giver and each these chapters when considering your giving.

Some key principles are that we should give:

- Sacrificially (8:1-2) accepting the personal cost
- Generously (8:3-7) as much as we are able for the salvation of others

- Realistically (8:10-12) according to our capacity
- Equally (8:13-15) giving of our plenty to help others
- Carefully (8:16-24) so that we are good stewards of God's money

We have worked hard to budget and plan our costs for the coming year with this vision in mind.

OUR COSTS


In calendar year 2020 we are budgeting to spend £379k. In line with our vision, this breaks down into four areas: Learning, sharing, giving and Support. We have roughly allocated our staff costs across the four areas based on approximations of time spent.


In 2020 we plan to spend £118k on Learning; funding Ministry Trainees and providing sound Bible teaching so that individually and collectively we are built up and equipped to share the gospel. We plan to spend £109k on Sharing; resourcing evangelism as well as mercy ministry in our local area. We plan to maintain our **Giving**, financially

contributing to gospel ministry outside our churches, by allocating £66k, or 18% of our total income. Underpinning our Vision, at roughly 22%, is **Support**. This covers the costs of maintaining the church buildings and running the church office.

OUR INCOMF

We have three streams of income to raise this money: giving from the two congregations (including Gift Aid tax reclaimed), rental income and grants from other bodies (such as the YMCA who support our youth and children's work). In 2020 we expect to, God willing, balance our books. But we are also anticipating giving from the congregations to decrease, because of some moving away and others needing to reduce their giving. We are appealing for an increase in giving now in order that we may continue to train the next generation of gospel workers and grow our own gospel work through staffing. We need to raise an additional £10k per year to pay for a ministry trainee and a further £45k per year to fund a full-time staff worker from mid-2021.

How much we give will inevitably vary. Regular giving from individuals or families at St John with St Andrew currently ranges from small amounts to more than £600 each month and we are imgift.
